

The Community Corrections and Treatment Center (CCTC) in Cleveland is a comprehensive community corrections center that provides highly structured, evidence based programs designed to assist non-violent, felony offenders in successfully transitioning into their community.

The structure and level of supervision provided at CCTC assures accountability for the offender, while the programming and learning opportunities are designed to help offenders make positive behavioral changes that result in reduced recidivism and safer communities.

CCTC is operated by Oriana House, Inc., and is accredited by the American Correctional Association; licensed by the Ohio Department of Rehabilitation and Correction; and certified by the Ohio Department of Alcohol and Drug Addiction Services.

CCTC PROGRAM OPTIONS

Federal Referrals: Since 2001, CCTC continues to serve as a Comprehensive Sanction Center for the Federal Bureau of Prisons. CCTC serves federal pre-release clients, federal clients sanctioned by a federal judge, or federal clients sanctioned by their United States probation officer. In 2006, CCTC entered into a contract with the United States Probation Office to provide pre-trial treatment services to federal defendants awaiting trial.

Halfway House: This rehabilitative program is up to six months in length and includes services to assist the offender in successfully returning to the community.

Parole/Post Release Control: Offenders placed on parole must meet strict program requirements as they transition back into the community.

Transitional Control: This is a highly structured, residential program for appropriate offenders who are serving their last one to six months of a prison sentence.

Electronic Monitoring: Offenders sentenced to their home are electronically monitored 24/7 to confirm their compliance with sentencing restrictions.

Cuyahoga County Jail Reduction Program: This program was implemented in 2006 with Oriana House and other licensed halfway house providers in Cuyahoga County to address county jail overcrowding. Offenders who are in jail may be eligible for early release if they complete a treatment program under the supervision of the Cuyahoga County Adult Probation Department.

It is the policy of Oriana House, Inc., to provide treatment to all clients regardless of race, color, national origin, disability, age, sex, or religion. 3/08

Referral Sources

Offenders may be referred to the Oriana House CCTC from several sources:

Transfers from Federal and State Institutions - these offenders have served a portion of their sentence in a federal or state institution and are completing their confinement at CCTC.

Supervision Cases - these offenders are under federal/state supervision and are in need of additional treatment services.

Cuyahoga County Cases - these offenders are either sentenced directly from the Cuyahoga County Court of Common Pleas or as a condition of probation supervised by the Cuyahoga County Adult Probation Department. Clients are also referred to CCTC through the county's jail reduction initiative.

Federal Pretrial Services - CCTC has a contract with the United States Probation Office to provide pretrial treatment services to federal defendants awaiting trial.

CCTC Programming and Services

CCTC maintains a cognitive behavioral environment that is evidence based and proven most effective with offenders. Clients are provided with a range of programming including case management, cognitive therapies, mental health services, substance abuse treatment, employment and housing assistance, 12-step programs, parenting skills enhancements, family support services, and religious services. A daily regimen of structured activities helps clients develop a sense of responsibility and self-sufficiency; facilitates their ability to pay rent, restitution, and taxes; and provides opportunities to establish critical ties to family and community.

While in residency, clients can receive visitors at the facility. Release from the facility is permitted only for verified work, education, treatment, and authorized activities.

Staff work closely with the Federal and State Probation Departments, and Federal and State probation officers are on-site and active in program planning.

To successfully complete the CCTC program, a client must complete all required phases and demonstrate an ability to be a law abiding, self sufficient member of the community.

Drug & Alcohol Treatment

A Framework for Recovery is a cognitive based chemical dependency curriculum designed for men and women who face the challenge of overcoming a substance abuse problem. This curriculum provides critical thinking skills that assist the client in making lifestyle changes that are necessary for long term recovery. Clients undergo random drug screens and alcohol tests.

Cognitive Skills

Cognitive Skills class addresses the major thinking errors that lead to criminal behavior and ways to correct these errors. The class uses role playing to help clients develop skills and responsible, productive thinking patterns that lead to a more successful life.

Education

Clients in need of educational assistance participate in a community program as established with their assigned caseworker.

Employment

All clients receive employment readiness training and are screened for job skills and interests. The curriculum includes resume writing, interviewing techniques, role playing, and providing clients with communication tools to converse with potential employers on past criminal history.

Electronic Monitoring

After completing the first phase of the CCTC program and demonstrating responsibility and positive changes in behavior, some clients may earn the privilege of going on electronic monitoring (home confinement).

Cost to Client

When employed, the client pays a portion of the treatment costs. Clients must also address financial obligations such as court costs, child support, fines, and restitution.

Screening Process

Due to zoning restrictions, the following individuals are not eligible: offenders who are convicted of murder, rape, or any felony offense against a minor; and offenders adjudicated as a Tier III or Tier II sexual offender who the court has determined are subject to community notification.
